Statement of Purpose

Studying abroad is an opportunity that would be not only be enjoyable but would also help me in my future career. When I graduate with both my majors in Mexican American studies and in public administration, I would like to be the founder of a non-profit organization that helps children who are citizens of the United States whose parents have been deported. Working in this environment would require me to work with parents and children who speak foreign languages, predominantly Spanish. Since most immigrants in recent years have come from Mexico and other Spanish speaking countries, it is important to be able to effectively communicate with them in that language. I am currently trying to teach my eight-year-old daughter Spanish and often find myself needing help with Spanish myself. Being around Spanish speakers in Spain and taking an intermediate Spanish course while abroad will help improve my Spanish. With improvements of my Spanish, I would not only be sure that I am properly teaching my daughter Spanish but can also be of better assistance to the children and parents that I would be working with.

My future career would also expose me to many different cultural backgrounds. The experience of studying abroad in Spain would also be beneficial in that it will further my experience in communicating with people from different cultures. This would be my first time going overseas. The interpersonal speech class that I intend to take while in Spain, focuses on the type of intercultural communication that will be just as useful as the Spanish language.

One of the reasons that I chose to study Mexican American studies is because of my fascination with the origins of the culture of Mexican-Americans. A significant part of Mexican-American identity is born from Spanish heritage. Studying in Spain would allow me to further explore the Spanish side of the Mexican-American heritage. Service Project Proposal
